Review level content for your struggling students!

The WordFlyers Review level content sees the addition of 40 new units added to the WordFlyers program. Each year level (7, 8, 9 and 10) will gain ten supplementary units designed for students who may find the current WordFlyers content too difficult to read or understand.

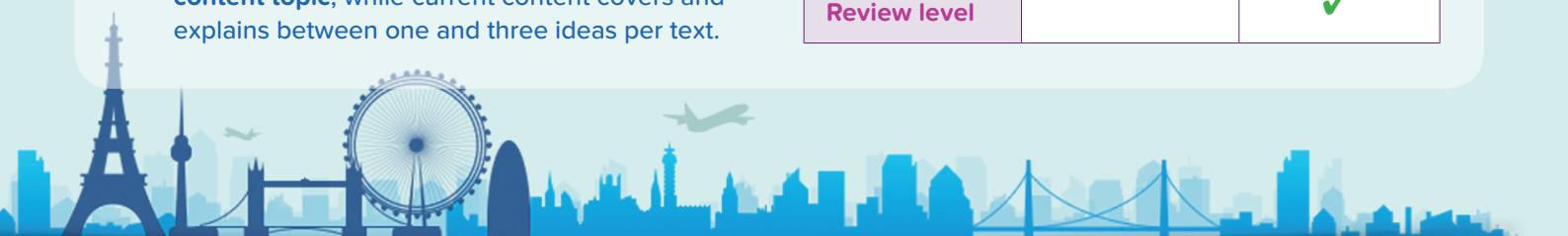


Here is some important information about the new Review level, which will benefit you and your students:

- ✓ The Review level is **designed for students who may have trouble reading and understanding the current content** on the WordFlyers program.
- ✓ **The 40 new units** include texts that feature photographs and illustrations to support student understanding, and increase student interest and motivation.
- ✓ Unit texts are **approximately 200 words in length**, as opposed to the current content texts, which range from 300+ words.
- ✓ Each tutorial in a **Review level covers just one content topic**, while current content covers and explains between one and three ideas per text.




More features of the new Review level content include:

- ✓ Tutorials are written in clear, concise sentences and are supported by examples, which further explain the key point.
- ✓ Most importantly, the new Review level content looks very similar to the current content on WordFlyers, meaning that students working on this level will not be made to feel that their work is different to their classmates.
- ✓ Teachers will have control over assigning students to Review level units. Students will not be placed on a Review level automatically.

Tips for utilising the new Review level content:

- ✓ If you are unsure about assigning a unit from the WordFlyers levels that is different to your student's school year level, we encourage you to assign the same Review year level as your student's school year (e.g. a year 10 student would be encouraged to work on the Review level units chosen specifically for Year 10).
- ✓ If you place your students on level 7 Review, regardless of their school year, students will experience a sequential series of lessons that teach Australian Curriculum: English content from Year 2 – Year 8.

Bright star

Professional snowboarder Torah Bright is Australia's most successful female Winter Olympian.

A win in the women's half-pipe competition at the 2010 Vancouver Games saw Bright take home Australia's fourth Winter Olympics gold medal. Bright followed up this success with a silver medal in the same event at the 2014 Sochi Winter Olympics.

Bright is respected for her courage as well as her skill. Immediately before her Olympic gold medal performance, Bright fell twice during training and suffered two concussions. She bravely fought back and went on to win the event.


One of five children, Bright learned to ski at an early age and switched to snowboarding at age 11. She was inspired by her older brother, Ben, who is now her coach.
