

5 easy steps to use WordFlyers for grammar homework

Use WordFlyers to quickly set your students a series of grammar-focused lessons that will teach them the components of simple, compound and complex sentences and how to enhance their writing by expanding simple sentences.

Follow these 5 simple steps and the lesson options to create grammar homework for your whole class or individual students today.

1. Select Study Plans from the left navigation on your teacher dashboard.

2. Click Add to create a new study plan. Type in a name for your study plan. Then click Create.

3. Add students to your study plan by clicking Add class or Add students individually.

4. Select Add tasks and use the Grammar lessons list below to find the content. Then click on the unit name and select the Grammar lesson. Select Activate to save the Study Plan.

5. Your students will receive a message that you have set them homework.
