

It is essential you understand the content levels in WordFlyers. This is how we prove the website offers content of varying levels, and that teachers can create differentiated lessons for every student in their class.

Always have hard copies of the WordFlyers levels table to give to teachers during a presentation. This table is confusing to read projected on a large screen. It is best to supply a copy to each teacher.

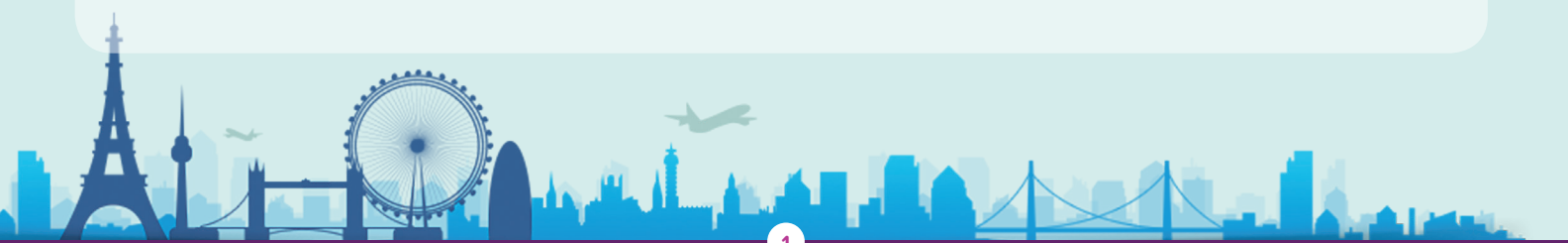
The table on the following page is highlighted to show common features across the levels that you should point out.

The 4 key features to explain

1. There are 16 levels of content – four WordFlyers levels for each school year level.
2. The Review (also known as .0) and .1 levels revise content from previous year levels.
These are marked in **violet**.
3. The .2 Levels are 'on level' content as indicated in the Australian Curriculum: English for the Literacy and Language strands.
These are marked in **light blue**.
4. The .3 Levels are also 'on level' but the questions are more challenging. Units in these levels are most suitable for students who already have good to strong literacy skills.
These are marked in **purple**.



WordFlyers levels



WordFlyers

Each level consists of 8 units and a total of 80 lessons. There are 10 lessons in each unit.

Students do not see the year levels 7 to 10 or the WordFlyers levels, such as 7.1 and 8.2.

They see only Journeys and Gates, e.g. Journey 1, Gate 2.
